



Parts Grading

Most Auto Recyclers have adopted the industry standard parts grading process. This process was developed to improve continuity in grading across the industry of auto recycling. The Automotive Recyclers Association (ARA) helped with this grading system and this grading process has been infused into all aspects of our software. This infusion is out of our control. Our parts are automatically graded by the software. The grading process is broke down into vehicle components:

Mechanical parts are graded based on mileage per year. Example: A Grade Mechanical Parts “A” parts have less than 60,000 total miles, or if over 60,000 miles, must be less than 15,000 miles per model year of age.

Body panels and assemblies are graded based on condition and damage on the panel.

Miscellaneous parts like dash pads, seats, etc. are graded based on damaged and condition reported.

Wheels/covers are graded based on damage reported.
